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Craft Show Shelves Assembly

These are friction fit together as interlocking joints and there is no hardware.

Depending on humidity on your area you may have to sand the insides of the joints a little (not the shelf surfaces) if they are too tight. Wood swells in humidity. You may also rub a little paraffin wax on the joints (white candle wax). You can also buy small blocks of paraffin wax at crafts stores.

If you ordered more than one set of shelves I will put set numbers on each set. So, one set may have the number 1 on all the pieces, another set the number 2 on all the pieces. This is because I fit the pieces in each set and they may not fit was well in another set. They're all almost identical and would fit in most cases. Sand joint sanding may be required to fit unmatched sets.

If the shelves become tight after a few days on display at a show, or in storage, you can tap them apart with a rubber mallet, but you should not have to apply a lot of force.
